HAND-RAISING NEEDS

What are Hand-Raising Needs?

Hand-Raising Needs are a way for volunteers to express interest in your opportunity without actually signing up. Here are a few questions to ask yourself when determining if you should create your own hand-raising Needs:

- Do you want interested volunteers to complete a round of interviews, onboarding steps, paperwork, or special training before they can participate with your agency?
- Do you want to vet interested volunteers to ensure their skillsets and backgrounds align with your agency's goals and needs?
- Would you like to compile a waitlist of interested volunteers to assign and schedule as necessary?

If you answered yes to any of the above, then Hand-Raising Needs are a great way to meet those demands!

Steps in the process

- 1. The volunteer responds to an opportunity that clearly emphasizes they're only showing interest—not signing up just yet, but rather raising their hand for it.
- 2. You can then review the responses of interested volunteers and decide to move forward with the application and vetting process from there.
- 3. Once the volunteers is approved, they can then be added to a User Group assigned to the private opportunity. (Please reach out to your Site Manager about creating a User Group for those volunteers).
- 4. When they're in the User Group, they can access the private opportunity and respond to it.
- 5. Now, you can start scheduling them!
